# **Highlights of the Summer Term**

Intra -Trust Geography Competition - We were delighted that Laurus Ryecroft triumphed in the first ever intra-Trust Geography Quiz where all the Laurus Trust high schools competed against each other. Congratulations to all our geographers who brought home the trophy!



The Junior Maths Challenge – Over 4,000 schools nationwide took part in the Junior Maths Challenge and we were delighted to discover that two of our students had gained a silver award and six had gained bronze!



**Bosworth battlefields trip** – Nearly 100 students travelled to the Bosworth battlefields to get a real experience of battle in the 1400s. Students especially enjoyed trying out some replica medieval weapons!

**The Summer Chamber Concert** – Over 40 students performed at our first ever music concert. Most of our musicians only took up their instruments this year and they all showed incredible courage to stand up and perform in front of a packed audience.





**Sergeant Simon** – Our drama specialist came in to take our students through their paces as a WW1 drill sergeant. The immersive drama workshop complemented their current studies of the book 'Stay where you are and then leave' by John Boyne.
