This is the story about how one ordinary nine-year-old child and three classmates are full of empathy for Ahmet, a boy that comes to their school as a refugee from Syria. A story that explores the theme of displacement, which you will explore through many of the texts you study this year, including The Odyssey, The Tempest, and The Woman in Black.

Cemetary Boys by Aiden Thomas

When his traditional Latinx family has problems accepting his gender, Yadriel becomes determined to prove himself a real brujo. With the help of his cousin and best friend Maritza, he performs the ritual himself, and then sets out to find the ghost of his murdered cousin and set it free. This novel is written in English but unapologetically and authentically uses Spanish, too.

In The Sea There Are Crocodiles by Fabio Geda

The story of a ten-year-old Afghan boy who escapes from Afghanistan and makes his way through Iran, Turkey, and Greece and eventually to Italy. It is a frank, revealing and clear-eyed testament of the experiences faced by a young asylum-seeker in the contemporary world. This is an incredibly story which you can use in preparation for beliefs and values' unit looking at religious conflict and questioning the idea that 'it will never happen to us. 'We chose this book as we discuss population and migration in this year's scheme of work. The book offers a firsthand perspective and explores the reasoning why people might migrate. It also offers an opportunity to promote empathy as students can explore how living standards may be different elsewhere.

History Revolution - Jennifer Donnelly

Two girls, two centuries apart. One never knowing the other. But when Andi finds Alexandrine's diary, she recognizes something in her words and is moved to the point of obsession. There's comfort and distraction for Andi in the journal's antique page. Until, on a midnight journey through the catacombs of Paris, Alexandrine's words transcend paper and time, and the past becomes suddenly, terrifyingly present. We chose this book as it explores the complex reasons behind why the French overthrew their own monarchy and the lasting consequences of this event on the entire world.

Beliefs and Values The Henna Wars by Adiba Jaigirdar

When Nishat comes out to her parents, they say she can be anyone she wants—as long as she isn't herself. Because Muslim girls aren't lesbians. Nishat doesn't want to hide who she is, but she also doesn't want to lose her relationship with her family. And her life only gets harder once a childhood friend walks back into her life. Flávia is beautiful and charismatic, and Nishat falls for her instantly. But when a school competition invites students to create their own businesses, both Flávia and Nishat choose to do henna, even though Flávia is appropriating Nishat's culture. Amidst sabotage and school stress, their lives get more tangled—but Nishat can't quite get rid of her crush on Flávia and realizes there might be more to her than she realized.

Counting by 7s by Holly Goldberg Sloan

Willow Chance is a twelve-year-old genius, obsessed with nature and diagnosing medical conditions, who finds it comforting to count by 7s. This is a great cross-curricular read as Willow's perceptions of people, her interaction, and her routines, are driven by her extreme intelligence and enthusiasms for things, like maths, food, hygiene, and the environment. It sets her apart and she likes it that way. This book has been chosen to introduce you to Mathematical concepts and key words. We hope that this fun fictional text which incorporates some mathematical ideas. Our librarian thinks this is an especially great read for fans of Wonder by R. J. Palacio.

Scavengers by Darren Simpson

Landfill has lived his whole life as a scavenger, running with wooflers, swimming with turtles and feasting on fresh gull. Old Babagoo has always looked after him, on one condition – follow his rules. Never come looking Outside. Never rise above the wall. But despite the dangers, Landfill longs to see Outside. And some rules are made to be broken.

Welcome to Trashland by Steve Cole

Theo lives in a vast dumping ground of broken electronics in Ghana. He searches the trash for metal scraps to sell for cash, and dreams of going to school and escaping this harsh life. So, when Emanuel turns up with talk of buried treasure, Theo sees a chance to get out of Trashland. But Emanuel draws the attention of a local gang, and Theo realises his new friend is keeping dangerous secrets...

When Life Gives You Mangoes by Kereen Getten

Nothing much happens in Sycamore, the small village where Clara lives - at least, that's how it looks. She loves eating ripe mangoes fallen from trees, running outside in the rainy season, and escaping to her secret hideout with her best friend Gaynah. There's only one problem - she can't remember anything that happened last summer. When a quirky girl called Rudy arrives from England, everything starts to change. Gaynah stops acting like a best friend, while Rudy and Clara roam across the island and uncover an old family secret. As the summer reaches its peak and the island storms begin, Clara's memory starts to return, and she must finally face the truth of what happened last year.

Design and Cinder by Marissa Meyer Technology

Cinder, a gifted mechanic in New Bejing, is also a cyborg. She's reviled by her stepmother and blamed for her stepsister's sudden illness. But when her life becomes entwined with the handsome Prince Kai's, she finds herself at the centre of a violent struggle between the desires of an evil queen – and a dangerous temptation. Cinder is caught between duty and freedom,

loyalty, and betrayal. Now she must uncover secrets about her mysterious past in order to protect Earth's future.
